
# **QIKIQTANI**

INUIT ASSOCIATION

The Qikiqtani Inuit Association (QIA) is a not-for-profit society, which represents approximately 15,500 Inuit in the Qikiqtani region of Nunavut. The Qikiqtani region includes 13 communities from Grise Fiord, in the High Arctic, down to Sanikiluaq, on the Belcher Islands.

QIA was established to protect, promote and advance the rights and benefits of Qikiqtani Inuit. It is a Designated Inuit Organization under the Nunavut Agreement. QIA is one of three Regional Inuit Associations affiliated with Nunavut Tunngavik Inc.; the other associations include the Kitikmeot Inuit Association and the Kivalliq Inuit Association. We work closely with our partners, such as Inuit Tapiriit Kanatami and the Inuit Circumpolar Council Canada, as well as different levels of government, to represent Inuit in the Inuit Nunangat.

Two other organizations operate under the QIA umbrella: Kakivak Association, responsible for community economic development and small businesses; and Qikiqtaaluk Corporation, created to manage economic development on behalf of QIA.

Akeeagok's legacy cannot be understated. He has advanced Qikiqtani Inuit interests in vital areas of reconciliation, environmental stewardship, and cultural preservation. Through Akeeagok's leadership we are on a path towards a prosperous diversified economy. I thank Akeeagok wholeheartedly. Through his dedication, devotion, and hard work he has brought positive changes and impacts to the day-to-day lives of Qikiqtani Inuit.

This September, I was officially appointed QIA President until the term ending in December of 2022. My priorities are very much in line with former QIA President Akeeagok's. Qikiqtani Inuit can expect a continuation of service, dedication, and respect. I'm extremely thankful and humbled by the Board of Director's decision to appoint me to this position.

2020-2021 proved to be a challenging year with the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. The pandemic forced many of QIA's regular programs to be suspended. Our team redirected our focus and delivered COVID-19 programming to support Qikiqtani Inuit across the Region during these challenging times.

QIA focused COVID-19 initiatives in three categories: food security, mental wellness, and isolation support for households.

In October of 2020, we launched the Mental Wellness Initiative. To support mental wellness activities during the COVID-19 pandemic QIA distributed \$1.88 million to local government and community non-profit organizations.

In November, we distributed \$2.65 million in the form of \$1000 grants to Qikiqtani families to be used for harvesting, groceries and sewing projects. In total, 2,660 Inuit households received this assistance.

In December, QIA provided \$731,000 in food vouchers to assist approximately 1,600 economically vulnerable Qikiqtani Inuit. That same month we distributed \$312,000 to the 23 schools across the Region to enhance and support school food programs.

For communities that experienced active cases of COVID-19, QIA provided additional supports. In Iqaluit and Kinngait we relaunched the Emergency Land Access Initiative. These one-time \$1,500 grants supported households to self-isolate on-the-land. We also provided over \$3 million in grocery vouchers and food hampers to Qikiqtani Inuit over the age of 16 in Iqaluit and Kinngait.

Throughout the pandemic we have continued to support our Elders, and through supporting our Elders we have helped our communities to thrive. In February and again in May 2021, we distributed food hampers and grocery vouchers to Qikiqtani Elders.

In 2021, we delivered broad support to Qikiqtani Inuit residing within the Region, but also to Qikiqtani Inuit living outside Nunavut. In July, we launched our Food Security for Qikiqtani Urban Inuit Program. Often Qikiqtani Inuit who reside outside of Nunavut are unable to access programming. This new program provided support to Qikiqtani Inuit regardless of their current address.




As the stress of the pandemic wound down in the spring, we took time to gather. We hosted a Community Liaison Officer (CLO) meeting and a Nauttiqsuqtiit meeting. This was a great opportunity for members of our staff from across the Region to get to know each other and the organization better. The CLOs learned about the different divisions across QIA, while the Nauttiqsuqtiit participated in on-the-land training.

Important decisions about the economic future of the territory were also made this year. In June, the QIA Board of Directors unanimously voted to not support Phase 2 of Baffinland's Mary River Mine Project. Throughout the NIRB hearings our Board we heard loud and clear from members of the impacted communities that the project was moving too fast and that the effects on marine and terrestrial life were too uncertain. QIA is, and will continue to be, open to Inuit-led resource development within our Region.

This year has brought many challenges to QIA, and the rest of the world, as we all chart our way through this pandemic. At QIA we have come through these challenges as a unified organization. We have delivered over \$18.9 million in COVID-19 relief to Qikiqtani Inuit since the beginning of the pandemic. This is an unprecedented accomplishment for our staff, and I'd like to take this opportunity to commend them.

I believe the future is bright for Qikiqtani Inuit. We at QIA will continue to advocate, negotiate, and build a diverse economy for the Qikiqtani Region. I couldn't be prouder of our daily operations, and I look forward to the work we will be putting forward in the years to come.

COVID-19 changed the way we live and work. Throughout 2020 and 2021, QIA implemented COVID-19 response measures to support Qikiqtani Inuit. Our staff's efforts were directed to develop and deliver COVID-19 emergency initiatives. QIA followed all public health advice. This required us to suspend our regular programs. During times we also closed our offices to the public while still continuing to offer our services via working from home.

In December 2020, QIA released its third round of COVID-19 initiatives. The third round of COVID-19 funding totaled \$2,008,101. This funding included emergency grocery vouchers for families on income support, COVID-19 impacted community support initiative for Sanikiluaq, and a school food program initiative.

QIA also launched the Family Support Initiative, the Emergency Land Access Initiative, and the Food Security program for Qikiqtani Urban Inuit.

In efforts to make the support more easily accessible to Qikiqtani Inuit, QIA simplified the application process with online applications through our website, as well as assistance through our head office and Community Liaison Officers. The online applications were very successful, with some programs at capacity within a matter of days.

Qikiqtani families expressed their gratitude and sent photos and messages from their on-the-land trips from across the Region. Elders have told us that the grocery vouchers made a big difference in their lives – giving them regular access to necessary household goods.

QIA also supported vaccination clinics around the Qikiqtani Region. Through QIA's social media efforts we promoted vaccination, creating fun and accessible information answering many of the questions surrounding vaccinations.

The funds for QIA's COVID-19 response plan were from the Government of Canada's Indigenous Community Support Fund.



#### **QIKIQTANI FAMILY SUPPORT INITIATIVE**


The Qikiqtani Family Support Initiative assisted Inuit families during the COVID-19 pandemic. On November 4, 2020, the online application opened. In 24 hours QIA received more than 2,000 applications, a record for our programs, confirming this program was wanted and needed by Qikiqtani Inuit.

To support more Qikiqtani Inuit to access this initiative, QIA quickly responded by adjusting the grant from \$1,500 to \$1,000 for each eligible household. This allowed a total of 2,660 Qikiqtani families to receive support. In total QIA provided \$2.65 million for the Qikiqtani Family Support Initiative.

#### **QIKIQTANI INCOME SUPPORT**

The impact of the pandemic has been greatest felt by Indigenous people and those with lower income.

Responding to this, QIA put in place support targeting Qikiqtani Inuit families who received income support. In December 2020, each eligible Qikiqtani household received a one-time \$423 grocery voucher for the Arctic Co-op or Northern Store. In total QIA distributed \$731,250 in grocery vouchers to families in need.

#### **QIKIQTANI SCHOOL FOOD PROGRAM**

Availability of healthy food can be challenging in our remote communities. Proper nutrition is necessary for growing children.

To help our Qikiqtani youth QIA launched the School Food Program. Program funding was used to deliver food hampers to families with school aged children, to distribute country food and to support school breakfast and lunch programs.

Attagoyuk High School in Pangnirtung spent part of their funds to purchase 10 whole caribou. The meat was shared while the students learned about the animal and the harvesting process.

Nuiyak Elementary School in Sanikiluaq spent part of their funds to buy food for mini hampers to distribute to students and their families.

The QIA Emergency Voucher for Elders program provided short-term financial support to Qikiqtani Inuit Elders during the COVID-19 pandemic to support purchasing groceries and necessary cleaning supplies.

To date QIA has run three rounds of the Emergency Vouchers for Elders. The program was launched with the first round of vouchers distributed in April 2020 in partnership with Arctic Co-operatives Limited, and Ilisaqsivik Society in Clyde River. \$3 Million was distributed to Inuit Elders through the first round of youchers.


A second round was launched in November 2020. QIA worked in partnership with Arctic Co-operatives to distribute six grocery vouchers to Qikiqtani Inuit Elders. Each Elder received \$1,500 in vouchers, totaling \$1.8 Million distributed.

In November, the program was expanded to include Urban Inuit who are originally from Qikiqtani communities. Inuit living outside Qikiqtani Region who are registered with the Nunavut Tunngavik Inc. received a one-time payment of \$750.

A third round of Emergency Grocery Vouchers for Elders ran from May to June 2021. Each Qikiqtani Elder received four vouchers for a total of \$1,000.

Since beginning this program QIA has provided over \$5.4 million to Qikiqtani Inuit Elders to support them throughout the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Emergency Grocery Vouchers initiative was made available thanks to funding from the Government of Canada's Indigenous Communities Support Fund.

In May and June, QIA worked in partnership with Arctic Co-operatives Limited to distribute food hampers and grocery vouchers to Qikiqtani Inuit living in Kinngait. Each Inuit household received \$750 in grocery vouchers and two food hampers.

In Iqaluit, QIA worked in partnership with Ayaya to distribute two rounds of grocery vouchers. Community members were able to pick up their vouchers or could sign up for no contact delivery. Inuit living in Iqaluit received grocery vouchers to Ventures Marketplace and Northmart stores.

The COVID-19 pandemic has been challenging for all Qikiqtani Inuit including those living outside the territory. That is why in July 2021, QIA launched the Food Security for Qikiqtani Urban Inuit Program. This new programming provided support to Qikiqtani Inuit regardless of their current address. Eligible families were able to apply for a first come first serve grant of \$1,000 per household. This program supported over 500 Qikiqtani families living outside of Nunavut.

The Food Security Program funding was provided by Indigenous Services Canada for emergency relief in communities affected by COVID-19.

In April 2021, positive cases of COVID-19 were reported in Kinngait and Iqaluit. QIA immediately directed our efforts to support these communities. QIA worked with the Government of Nunavut, Nunavut Tunngavik Inc., and our contacts at Arctic Co-operatives to ensure families received groceries and other social ws needed to self-isolate.

QIA provided \$1,235,000 to help Inuit get on-the-land so they could socially distance and harvest healthy country food. The Emergency Land Access Initiative was available for families in Kinngait and Iqaluit. Eight hundred Qikiqtani Inuit house-holds with established camps or cabins received a one-time grant of \$1,500. The funds were used to purchase fuel, ammunition, food and other supplies needed while out on-the-land. The money for this program came from the Federal Government's Indigenous Community Support Fund.

#### **ILISAQSIVIK SOCIETY: \$517,000**

QIA partnered with Ilisaqsivik to increase Inuit-led mental health and wellness capacity in the Qikiqtani Region such as preparing social supports for those asked to self-isolate due to COVID-19.

#### **THE YWCA AGVIK: \$182,000**

The funds supported sewing programs and hosting storytelling and traditional games for women at the shelter. Funding also provided staff support for issues related to COVID-19 restrictions and shutdowns.

#### **UQUTAQ SOCIETY: \$237,000**

Funding bolstered programming and training such as on-the-land programs, counselling services, and mental health training.

#### **TUKISIGIARVIK SOCIETY: \$62,000**

The funds assisted with programs such as cabin building and qamutiik making.

# QIKIQTANI HAMLET RECREATION DEPARTMENTS: \$425,000

Funding supported Qikiqtani Hamlet recreation departments to provide youth mental wellness programming during the pandemic.

# **QIKIQTANI FAMILY SUPPORT INITIATIVE:** \$415,000

QIA announced the Qikiqtani Family Support Initiative on November 4, 2020. The \$415,000 was used to expand the initiative.

It is one that looks to right past inequities and repatriate quotas so that Inuit have access to the natural resources in our adjacent waters. The economic opportunities of a Blue Economy will foster future prosperity for Qikiqtani communities.



In 2019 QIA collaborated with the Government of Canada to knock down departmental silos and protect two of the largest marine areas in the country. Establishing Tallurutiup Imanga National Marine Conservation Area and providing interim protection for Tuvaijuittuq Marine Protected Area, not only tackled climate change, protected a significant multi-year ice area in the High Arctic, and safeguarded key wildlife habitat, it also created a new economic development model for Nunavut's Inuit communities based on a Blue Economy.

This was a step towards our Blue Economy vision.



QIA's Inuit stewardship and the Blue Economy in Nunavut's Qikiqtani Region 2020 report outlines QIA's vision for a Blue Economy. This vision requires investments such as bolstering the existing Nauttiqsuqtiit program developed as part of the Tallurutiup Imanga and Tuvaijuittuq agreements; funding for infrastructure such as Small Craft Harbours and a deep sea port in Qikiqtarjuaq; Inuit-led governance as a key pillar to all agreements; and support for Nunavut fisheries through repatriation of quotas.

QIA has continued to advocate for our vision of a Blue Economy. On August 4, 2021, former QIA President Akeeagok joined in an announcement for over \$50 million in new infrastructure funds for Small Craft Harbours and a deep sea port in Qikiqtarjuaq.

This marks another significant step towards our vision for a Blue Economy.

On August 4, 2021, former QIA President Akeeagok joined Federal Minister of Infrastructure and Communities the Honourable Catherine McKenna, Deputy Premier of Nunavut, the Honourable David Akeeagok, NTI President Aluki Kotierk, and ITK President Natan Obed in announcing over \$50 million in infrastructure funds.

These funds will support a deep sea port in Qikiqtarjuaq and Small Craft Harbours in Arctic Bay and Clyde River.

QIA has advocated for the deep sea port for years, recognizing its importance to a sustainable economy and opportunities for Inuit. The \$40 million federal investment will realize great benefits for the Qikiqtani Region. The deep sea port will allow fishing vessels to dock safely, will promote the fishing industry in our Region, and will improve our search and rescue abilities in the Arctic.



The \$15.588 million federal investment for Small Craft Harbours in Arctic Bay and Clyde River will support community members and Nauttiqsuqtiit in harvesting and traditional activities. They will help to provide safe access to the land and sea and will enable local sustainable businesses, such as fisheries and tourism. Of utmost importance, the harbours will increase access to country food and support food sovereignty in the communities.

This funding announcement represents a significant step towards QIA's vision for a Blue Economy.

Through the Tallurutiup Imanga Inuit Impact and Benefit Agreement negotiations, QIA secured funding from Parks Canada for multi-use facilities and food processing units in each of Arctic Bay, Clyde River, Grise Fiord, Pond Inlet and Resolute Bay. QIA has also secured funding from the Canadian Northern Economic Development Agency towards building a Regional Training Centre in Pond Inlet.

Throughout this past year, QIA has been working on feasibility and sustainability planning of the multi-use facilities and Regional Training Centre infrastructure.

Imaq is the Inuit advisory committee for the Tallurutiup Imanga National Marine Conservation Area. Imaq is made up of Community Directors from the five Tallurutiup Imanga communities—Arctic Bay, Pond Inlet, Grise Fiord, Resolute Bay and Clyde River, as well as QIA staff and executive members.

Imaq's role is to advise QIA on issues related to Tallurutiup Imanga National Marine Conservation Area. Eventually, Imaq will be made up of community members from each of the five communities, who will guide the governance of the important protected marine area.

One of the topics of this first meeting was to brief Imaq members on progress made on the Nauttiqsuqtiit program and the multi-use facilities and Regional Training Centre infrastructure projects.

The Nauttiqsuqtiit, Inuit Steward, program continues to staff full time positions in Arctic Bay, Clyde River, Grise Fiord, Pond Inlet and Resolute Bay. This program is providing Inuit jobs as environmental stewards and harvesters. It also provides a foundation for mentorship, training, and economic development for Inuit.

In August 2021, QIA announced the expansion of our Nauttiqsuqtiit program to Sanikiluaq. This expansion is an early benefit agreement between QIA and the Government of Canada, Department of Fisheries and Oceans as part of the anticipated establishment of Qikiqtait Marine Protected Area.

## NAUTTIQSUQTIIT ASSIST IN SEARCH AND RESCUE EFFORTS

In 2021 Nauttiqsuqtiit were instrumental in several search and rescue efforts throughout January and February. Nauttiqsuqtiit participated by joining search parties on-the-ground with QIA-bought snowmobiles and inReach devices. They also helped coordinate efforts by tracking search parties on computers and coordinating searchers over the phone.

As stewards of Tallurutiup Imanga, the Nauttiqsuqtiit monitor sea ice conditions for safe passage and lend a hand in search and rescue efforts in the community, using their knowledge of the local landscape. We were happy that each search and rescue effort resulted in hunters returning to their home community safely.

On August 14, 2019, the Government of Canada formally acknowledged and apologized for modern-day colonial practices imposed on Inuit in the Qikiqtani Region between 1950 and 1975, such as forced relocations, family separations, and killing of qimmiit.

Along with this apology was a signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and a promise of a renewed partnership towards positive change.

QIA continued our important work on the Qikiqtani Truth Commission through the initial \$21.1 million that QIA negotiated in the MOU. Despite the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, QIA has advanced work on two important aspects: the Qimmiit Revitalization Project, and Inuit Educational Resources.

#### **INUIT EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES**

Since the signing of the Agreement on August 14, 2019, QIA has engaged with other agencies on the need for programs and materials to educate Inuit and other Canadians about our history. This includes educational materials about the Qikiqtani Truth Commission. Today, many Canadians are still unfamiliar with the history of the Qikiqtani Region and the plight of Inuit who were forcibly relocated to advance Canada's nation-building interest in the Arctic.

On June 4, 2021, the Government of Nunavut and QIA signed a Memorandum of Understanding to create educational resources grounded in Inuit culture and language. These resources will help to strengthen cultural identity and Inuktitut language skills for preschool-aged children, K-12 students, and adult learners.

These resources will be a forward-looking campaign that celebrates Inuit leadership and commitment to building an inclusive Canada.

#### **QIMMIIT REVITALIZATION PROJECT**

Qimmiit (sled dogs) are central to Inuit culture and history. Inuit have traditionally used qimmiit to travel and harvest. The QIA Board of Directors felt that it was imperative that QIA deliver programming that honours the loss of qimmiit and that would also help to revive this important part of Inuit culture threatened by colonial practices and support intergenerational learning.

In 2020, the Qimmiit Revitalization Program was launched. To date the program has been focused on the following projects:

- Hiring a full-time Qimmiit Revitalization Coordinator
- Creating a Qimuksiqtiit (dog team owners) Database
- Launching the Qikiqtani Qimuksiqtiit Project
- Supporting the Nunavut Quest

In October 2020, QIA launched the Qikiqtani Qimuksiqtiit Project (QQP). This Program provides financial support to Qikiqtani Inuit dog team owners to build and strengthen their dog teams and cover costs related to their qimmiit. Through QPP, we learned that are 63 active qimuksiqtiit in our Region. This number is growing.

The QQP is a three-year project which will run until March 2023.

As part of the Qimmiit Revitalization Program, QIA committed to provide \$100,000 each year to the Nunavut Quest for seven years. Unfortunately, because of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Nunavut Quest was cancelled in 2020 and 2021.

This year QIA provided \$10,000 to cover the Nunavut Quest event organizing expenses. Also, each of the 14 registered dog sled teams were given \$5,000 to help cover costs associated with preparing for the Nunavut Quest. With the last two years of the race cancelled, QIA has allocated an additional \$20,000 to increase QIA's support of future races.

Based on the years of discussions with impacted communities and stakeholders, and the Tusaqtavut studies, QIA's Board of Directors passed a resolution to not support Baffinland's Phase 2 proposal. Impacts to wildlife, the limited incorporation of Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit and the absence of a jointly developed Adaptive Management Plan were among the concerns of the Board.

QIA's Board of Directors remains open to resource development in the Qikiqtani Region and welcomes proposals from Baffinland that prioritize Inuit involvement, and that align with an Inuit vision of the future.

The current Mary River Project is permitted to operate on Inuit Owned Lands. QIA will continue to uphold Inuit rights and interests with respect to the current project.

To better understand the current and future impacts of Baffinland Iron Mines Corporation Mary River Mine Project on land use and the Inuit way of life, QIA conducted Tusaqtuvut Inuit-led studies and interviews in Arctic Bay, Clyde River, Iglulik, Pond Inlet and Sanirajak. Approximately 140 community members were interviewed, and three reports were created and submitted to the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB), highlighting the Project concerns and potential impacts to communities and community members.

The reports provide Inuit accounts of changes to the environment, animal habitat loss, impacts to archaeological sites and camping sites and interruptions to the flow of cultural knowledge between generations.

QIA conducted this research to ensure Inuit were speaking for Inuit in the NIRB assessment process for Baffinland's Phase 2 proposal for the Mary River Project.

QIA continues efforts to increase Inuit employment throughout the Qikiqtani Region with Tuttarvik, our online labour database, and the Qikiqtani Skills Training for Employment Partnership (Q-STEP). Tuttarvik connects Inuit to employment, education and skill development opportunities while Q-STEP provides Inuit the training needed for jobs in emerging sectors like mining. Q-STEP is funded partly by the Government of Canada's Skills and Partnership Fund.

In response to COVID-19 travel restrictions, QIA adapted the Q-STEP programming. This started with our Work Readiness Program which was delivered online. Participants provided positive feedback about being able to study in their home communities. This year the Work Readiness Program included more extensive financial literacy training.

This year QIA partnered with Nunavut Arctic College to provide a 12-week Pre-Trades Training program in Iqaluit, Arctic Bay and Pond Inlet. This was the first time the Pre-Trades Training was held in communities – usually it is held onsite at the Mary River mine.

Ten students graduated the Pre-Trades Training program and seven successfully passed the trades entrance exam which will allow them to begin a trades apprenticeship. Qikiqtani Inuit Association — 2020-2021 ANNUAL REPORT 53

QIA has been supporting Qikiqtani Inuit parents through the Daycare Subsidy Program since it was launched in 2017. Qikiqtani Inuit parents who use licensed daycare centers are eligible for the subsidy.

Kakivak Association delivers this subsidy on behalf of QIA.

During 2020-2021, this program reached nine communities and supported 224 daycare spaces for Inuit parents.

In 2020-2021, at the invitation of the Government of Nunavut, Department of Education, Early Learning Child Care Division, QIA embarked on an ambitious two-year story book development project. Under this project, QIA will develop up to 16 new books for children and daycares over the next two fiscal years. QIA, supported by Inhabit Media and Inhabit Education, will create four new books under the Tuktu and Friends series. As well, 12 storybooks will be authored by Inuit authors who will share their own stories about their community.

The funds for these initiatives come from QIA's Benefits Fund and the Government of Canada's Indigenous Languages and Cultures Program.

The Qikiqtani Cultural Activities Program (QCAP) is an application-based program that provides funding for community-led projects that foster the preservation and transmission of traditional skills and increase participation in cultural activities. The long-term intention of QCAP is to strengthen Inuit cultural identity and empower Qikiqtani Inuit.

In 2020-2021, under this program, QIA allocated \$650,000 for projects across all 13 Qikiqtani communities.

The COVID-19 pandemic impacted the delivery of QCAP in 2020-2021. QIA paused the delivery of all regular programming, including QCAP. QIA staff made best efforts to work with project leaders to adjust their projects so that they were able to proceed as restrictions eased.

Despite the impact of the pandemic, 43 of the 58 approved projects were completed. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, 15 projects were cancelled.

The value of cancelled projects was \$159,350. This unspent money was returned to the Legacy Fund to be invested.

Since 2014 the Ilagiiktunut fund has supported social and cultural projects for Inuit living in the five communities impacted by the Mary River Mine. QIA and Baffinland each contribute \$555,000 per year to the Fund, for a total of \$1.1 million per year. Organizations and Inuit based in, or working with, the impacted communities can apply for this Fund.

In 2020-2021 the Ilagiiktunut Fund supported many individuals and organizations to deliver important projects. In total 22 projects were funded this year. One individual who received funding was Terry Uyarak of Iglulik.

Uyarak used the funding he received to release his album, Nunarjua Isulinginniani in October 2020. Along with creating his album, the Ilagiiktunut Fund was used by Uyarak to create music videos based on dog sledding practices.

QIA was proud to learn that Terry's album was nominated for a 2021 Juno Award in the category Indigenous artist or group of the year and for his promotion of Inuit art, language and culture.

In October 2020, QIA Board of Directors passed a resolution to update the Grants and Contributions Program. The updated Program now offers each of the Qikiqtani Hamlets an annual grant of \$6,000 to support cultural and community events in their community.

In 2020 and 2021 Hamlet's used the grants for events such as hosting traditional Christmas games, Nunavut Day celebrations, and other community events.

This year QIA also contributed two \$5,000 donations to the Qikiqtani Region's bowhead whale hunts. In addition, a contribution of \$25,000 was made to Nunavut Sivuniksavut, a post-secondary program designed to empower and support Inuit youth.

This year marks a milestone, with over one million dollars being distributed to Qikiqtani Inuit youth through our scholarship program.

Each year QIA awards eighty \$2,500 QIA scholarships to post-secondary students from the Qikiqtani Region. QIA also awards the \$5,000 John Amagoalik scholarship to a deserving post-secondary student entering a field that promotes Inuit language and culture.

In October, QIA awarded the 2020-2021 John Amagoalik scholarship to Jenna Kilabuk. Originally from Pangnirtung, Kilabuk is in her second year of the four-year Nunavut Teacher Education Program at Nunavut Arctic College. In her application she explained how she hopes to honour John Amagoalik's legacy of serving Inuit and fostering Inuit culture and language as a teacher.

"I am honoured to have been selected as a recipient of the John Amagoalik Scholarship," states Kilabuk, "I believe John's journey and experiences has greatly contributed to the learning for individuals like me. I would like to thank QIA for making this opportunity available to Inuit students who are furthering their education for the betterment of Inuit. Qujannamiik!"

**3<sup>rd</sup> Place - Irene Qajaaq Willie**, Arctic Bay **Poem:** My Father.


Irene was awarded \$700 for her poem, "My Father". Irene's poem was inspired by and about her biological father. "It just came out of my mind and I started writing."

The Nunavut Agreement dedicates 356,000 km² of the land in Nunavut as Inuit Owned Land – almost the size of Newfoundland and Labrador. In Iqaluit, the Inuit Owned Land includes beach front area.

In March 2021, QIA released a questionnaire that proposed six options for managing the Inuit Owned Land along Iqaluit's waterfront in efforts to better understand how Inuit use the beach. QIA targeted responses from Elders, hunters, and shack owners as well as Inuit at broad.


The responses will be used to help guide QIA in how to manage the Inuit Owned Land beach in Iqaluit.

QIA has continued to promote and share our love of Inuktitut on Facebook, Instagram and Twitter through our Word of the Day project.

The Word of the Day project was created to promote Inuktitut language and Inuit artwork through QIA's Facebook, Instagram and Twitter social media.

The Word of the Day project launched in February 2017. The program posts a daily Inuktitut word and/or phrase with translation and pronunciation information and pairs it with Inuit artwork.

Our social media posts are shared hundreds of times daily across Canada, creating awareness and interest in Inuktitut.

In 2020-2021, QIA expanded the Word of the Day project by creating a TikTok account as well as posting interactive videos each Friday on each of our social media pages. QIA also improved our Word of the Day website by including audio clips. Users can click and learn beginner and intermediate Inuktitut words and phrases directly on our website (www.qia.ca/word-of-the-day).

QIA received funding from Government of Nunavut's Department of Culture and Heritage to continue and expand this project.

In June 2021, former QIA President virtually attended the Commissioning Ceremony of Her Majesty's Canadian Ship (HMCS) *Harry DeWolf.* The Royal Canadian Navy and President Akeeagok welcomed into service the first Arctic and offshore patrol ship.

The ship will be affiliated with regions of the Inuit Nunangat. The first affiliation between HMCS *Harry DeWolf* and the Qikiqtani Region was formalized in May 2019. Affiliation between a ship, its sailors and communities is a long-standing and honoured naval tradition, with relationships lasting throughout the service-life of the ship.

HMSC *Harry DeWolf* is scheduled to travel through the Northwest Passage in August 2021.

Kakivak Association is the non-profit community economic development organization and small business arm of QIA. Kakivak Association is a community economic development organization serving Inuit by providing programs and services to enhance the strengths of communities in the Qikiqtani Region.

Kakivak Association has four program and service delivery departments, Training and Employment, Childcare, Youth and Disabilities, Business Development and Career Services. In 2020-2021 Kakivak Association provided over \$8.2 million in total funding through a range of programs.

#### **PARTNERSHIPS ARE KEY TO SUCCESS**

Funding for Kakivak's program delivery is received through various agreements. The majority of funding is through Employment and Social Development Canada, with additional funding from QIA, Nunavut Tunngavik Incorporated (NTI), Indigenous Services Canada, and the Canadian Northern Economic Development Agency.

Kakivak Association provided support through a partnership with Qikiqtani Industry Ltd., Nunavut Construction Corporation and Habitat for Humanity Iqaluit for a new Pre-Trades Training Program. The goal of the program was to provide a combination of classroom instruction and hands-on experience to help prepare Inuit for roles in the construction industry.

#### **INUIT POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION PROGRAM**

In June 2020, Inuit Tapariit Kanatami (ITK) announced a new Inuit Post-Secondary Education Program. This enhanced programming provided equitable access for Inuit who live outside of Inuit Nunangat, allowing them to apply for funding through organizations based in their home regions. In the first year of delivery of the Inuit Post-Secondary Education Program Kakivak Association supported 111 students to attend college or university.

# KAKIVAK ASSOCIATION RESPONSE TO COVID-19

In 2020-2021, with the support of QIA, Kakivak Association rolled out new programs to assist businesses, non-profit organizations and students to help reduce the negative impacts of the Covid-19 pandemic.

Over \$1.5 million was approved through these programs, including operational support for 25 Inuit-owned businesses, helping to maintain employment for 76 Inuit and emergency assistance for 20 Inuit students and their families.

- The Qikiqtani Covid-19 Business Relief Program provided over \$437,000 to small Inuit-owned businesses that were forced to close or had significant reductions in revenue due to the pandemic.
- The Qikiqtani Covid-19 Wage Subsidy and Training Program provided over \$980,000 to help employers keep Inuit employed.
- The Qikiqtani Covid-19 Student Relief Program provided over \$160,000 to post-secondary education students with unplanned expenses due to the pandemic.
- Kakivak also provided medical grade air purifiers to the 22 childcare centres supported by Kakivak Association. Each purifier was shipped with a three-year supply of replacement filters and ultraviolet bulbs.

### **AQSARNIIT HOTEL AND CONFERENCE CENTRE**

The Aqsarniit Hotel and Conference Centre was on track to open in June 2020. The pandemic onset resulted in a reduced workforce delaying construction completion. Despite the pandemic setbacks, QC was proud to have the soft opening in October 2020.

Despite the economic downturn and travel restrictions, the facility still had meeting, event and guest bookings and the lounge and restaurant opened at reduced capacity. The 100% to date, the hotel employed a total of 76 part time and full-time employees, with a 60% Inuit employment rate continues to prioritize filling job vacancies with Qikiqtani Inuit as well as to training and promoting Inuit to move into supervisory roles.

#### **TALLURUTIUP IMANGA MULTI-USE FACILITIES**

QIA designated QC's wholly owned company, Qikiqtaaluk Business Development Corporation (QBDC), to lead the project management for the delivery of the five High Arctic Multi-Use Facilities and the Regional Training Centre in Pond Inlet.

In February and March of 2021, QBDC travelled to these communities to engage community leaders on these projects. QBDC advanced feasibility and sustainability plans in 2020-2021.

### **QIKIQTANI INDUSTRY LTD TRAINING PROGRAM**

In 2020-2021 QC's wholly owned company, Qikiqtani Industry Ltd, developed and delivered their first Pre-Employment Trades Training Program. This program includes six weeks of classroom learning, four weeks of hands-on learning, followed by a job placement. This program prepares students to learn basic techniques to ready them for the jobsite in the construction sector.







### **SANIKILUAQ WIND ENERGY DEVELOPMENT**

In April 2021, QBDC announced it successfully leveraged \$6.5 million from Natural Resources Canada to support a wind and battery energy storage project in Sanikiluaq.

The Sanikiluaq High Displacement Renewable Energy
Demonstration Project will see 1 MW of wind generation coupled
with 800 kWh of battery energy storage installed in the Hamlet
of Sanikiluaq. Producing over 4 GWh per year of clean electricity,
it is anticipated that the Project will offset over 50% of the
community's diesel fuel usage for electricity.

The Project will be owned and operated through a regional-community ownership model, ensuring project revenues remain within the community. Representing a true Inuit-led solution to renewable energy development in Nunavut, the Project will realize numerous local economic, social, and environmental benefits.

# COMMUNITY INVESTMENT AND SPONSORSHIPS

QC continues to support Qikiqtani communities, youth and leaders through contributions and sponsorships to events, community groups, programs and individuals.

In 2020-2021, QC, the QC Fisheries Division and Qikiqtaaluk Properties Inc. awarded three scholarships, with a total value of \$18,000. QC also awarded the first Ludy Pudluk scholarship in memory of late QC Board Member Ludy Pudluk. QC provided nearly \$50,000 in contributions to organizations and community events.

QC presented QIA, an annual dividend cheque for \$750,000 at the QIA Annual General Meeting in October 2020. Since the creation of the Dividends Policy in in 2016, QC has contributed over \$9,200,000 in dividends to QIA.


