## **QIKIQTANI**

INUIT ASSOCIATION

The Qikiqtani Inuit Association (QIA) is a not-for-profit society, which represents approximately 15,500 Inuit in the Qikiqtani Region of Nunavut. The Qikiqtani Region includes 13 communities from Grise Fiord, in the High Arctic, down to Sanikiluaq, on the Belcher Islands.

QIA was established to protect, promote and advance the rights and benefits of Qikiqtani Inuit. It is a Designated Inuit Organization under the Nunavut Agreement. QIA is one of three Regional Inuit Associations affiliated with Nunavut Tunngavik Inc.; the other associations include the Kitikmeot Inuit Association and the Kivalliq Inuit Association. We work closely with our partners, such as Inuit Tapiriit Kanatami and the Inuit Circumpolar Council Canada, as well as different levels of government, to represent Inuit in the Inuit Nunangat.

Two organizations operate under the QIA umbrella: Kakivak Association, responsible for community economic development and small businesses; and Qikiqtaaluk Corporation, created to manage economic development on behalf of QIA.



Qikiqtani Inuit Association (QIA) established a Revenue Policy in 2016. The Revenue Policy guides how QIA should invest and distribute funds to better serve Qikiqtani Inuit. This process allows clear and transparent reporting of how money is invested and used. The Revenue Policy created two new funds:

- The Legacy Fund, which invests money for the future
- The Benefits Fund, which delivers programs to Inuit

QIA's Revenue Policy is currently under review. Starting April 2022, QIA will hold community engagement sessions in each of the 13 Qikiqtani communities to ensure that emerging needs for Qikiqtani Inuit are being addressed through the Legacy Fund and Benefits Fund.

QIA would like to expand the spending and saving capabilities to include Community Benefits and Opportunities, and Economic Diversification.

To do this, amendments to the current Revenue Policy are required.

The Benefits Fund Policy outlines the process to determine the Key Themes and programs of the Benefits Fund. QIA will be seeking community feedback on Key Themes and how they can benefit Qikiqtani Inuit most. The review process includes extensive community engagement and program evaluations. The final selection of Key Themes and resulting programs is determined by the QIA Board of Directors.

Current Key Themes will remain until March 31, 2023, and include:

- Cultural Activities
- Daycare
- Early Childhood Education

The Legacy Fund revenues come from several sources, including payments from Inuit Impact and Benefit Agreements (IIBA) such as the Mary River IIBA, contributions to the Saimaqatigiingniq Fund, money received from Nunavut Tunngavik Inc. from mining revenues, sand and gravel projects on Inuit Owned Land within the Qikiqtani Region, interest from the Legacy Fund investments, and surplus revenues from the Economic Development Fund.

As the Legacy Fund grows, so does the Benefits Fund.

The Benefits Fund is used for social and cultural programs in the Qikiqtani Region. The Benefits Fund receives yearly payments from the Legacy Fund with an annual target return on investment of four per cent.

All programs delivered under the Benefits Fund must align with and advance the Key Themes, which are established by the QIA Board of Directors, as per the Benefits Fund Policy.

### **IMPACT OF COVID-19 ON PROGRAM DELIVERY**

The COVID-19 pandemic affected most QIA programs, including those funded by the Benefits Fund. Some of the projects that the Benefits Fund Committee and the QIA Executive Committee approved were suspended, and some were unable to proceed. As restrictions eased, QIA staff made best efforts to work with project leaders to modify their projects so they could be resumed. QIA is hopeful regular programming can resume for the 2022-2023 year.

Over the 2021-2022 fiscal year, Benefits Fund programs were delivered under the existing Key Themes: Cultural Activities, Daycare, and Early Childhood Learning.

The Key Themes were established in 2017, after extensive engagement with Qikiqtani communities, and were renewed by the QIA Board of Directors in 2019 for two more years.

Due to community lockdowns limiting QIA's ability to engage with the public regarding the Key Themes in 2021, the 2017 Key Themes were carried over for this fiscal year.

Public engagement is ongoing and may determine changes to the Key Themes in the future.

The Qikiqtani Cultural Activities Program (QCAP) is an application-based program designed to provide funding for community-led projects that support Qikiqtani Inuit to learn traditional skills and get out on-the-land. QCAP fosters the preservation and transmission of traditional skills and increases participation in cultural activities. The long-term intention of QCAP is to strengthen Inuit cultural identity and empower Qikiqtani Inuit.

Individual Inuit and community groups based in the Qikiqtani Region may apply for this funding. The funding may be used for materials and supplies, rental fees for equipment and venues, fees for Elders and other instructors, administration costs, and other costs directly related to their projects.

The QIA Board of Directors has given the Benefits Fund Committee authority to approve proposals under QCAP. All QCAP applications that QIA receives are reviewed by staff for completeness and compliance with program guidelines, and then presented to the Benefits Fund Committee for consideration.



The COVID-19 pandemic impacted the delivery of QCAP in 2021-2022. QIA paused the delivery of all regular programming, including QCAP. Additionally, some approved projects were unable to proceed due to public health restrictions.

For 2021-2022, QIA had two calls for applications, in March 2021 and in August 2021. In total, QIA received 63 applications, requesting a total of \$1,082,861 in funding:

- 51 projects were approved
  - ▶ Value of approved projects: \$769,286
- 12 approved projects were cancelled due to COVID-19 related restrictions limiting the ability to complete the project.
  - ▶ Value of cancelled projects: \$157,130
- 39 projects were funded
  - ▶ Value of funded projects: \$612,156


Unspent funds from the Benefits Fund are returned to the Legacy Fund and are not carried over into specific programs.

Over half (59 per cent) of the 51 projects approved in 2021-2022 were land-based activities. Thirty-nine per cent of the approved projects were sewing projects, and two per cent were classified as 'other' types of activities.

Land-based projects were run in all seasons and included trips by snowmobile and boat. Some were targeted at young people and others were focused on intergenerational learning. Most onthe-land projects were multi-day, overnight trips. Projects were focused on hunting, fishing, survival skills, and shelter-making.

Sewing projects included skin preparation, kamik-making, mitten-making, tent-making, and parka-making. Some projects were targeted at specific groups, such as youth and women.

The sole project categorized as 'other' was an Inuit Broadcasting Corporation project to digitize historical Inuktut language analogue programs and make them publicly accessible.



## QCAP PROJECT PROFILES

### **Nuusimaniq Camping Project, Iqaluit**

In summer 2021, youth in Iqaluit participated in a cultural skills trip funded by QCAP. Under project leader Levi Nowdluk, youth with minimal on-the-land experience were given the opportunity to learn what is needed for a safe camping trip.

Nowdluk taught youth, between 11 and 19 years of age, how to prepare for a trip on-the-land, including how to pack and organize camping and hunting gear. Youth also learned how to set fishing nets, and safely pack, store, and use hunting equipment. During their time on-the-land, the youth observed changes in weather and ocean tides and learned safe boating and camping practices during these changes.

Through camping, fishing, and hunting, the youth learned teamwork and on-the-land skills and a chance to experience traditional activities on our beautiful land and sea.



## Fishing/Hunting Trip, Clyde River

Lizzie Palituq used QCAP funding to help 18 Inuit participate in a fishing and hunting trip in Clyde River this year. This project was designed to help Inuit in Clyde River who do not have transportation or hunting equipment to take part in on-the-land activities, practice teamwork and enjoy activities that foster positive mental health.

During their time on-the-land, participants learned safe and effective boating, fishing, and hunting skills, as well as observing changing weather and landscape patterns.

Palituq said that all participants benefit from this project; those who do not have hunting equipment or on-the-land skills can learn, and participants with more experience and knowledge can better hone their skills and pick up new tips.

## Tent Making, Qikiqtarjuaq

Six participants in Qikiqtarjuaq learned how to create their own canvas tent through QCAP funding. Oolootie Comier guided participants in cutting patterns and sewing various sized tents. Comier was pleased to pass on this knowledge of sewing a tent, which has always vital to survival.



QIA has been supporting Qikiqtani Inuit parents through the Daycare Subsidy since 2017. Kakivak Association delivers this subsidy on behalf of QIA, and Qikiqtani Inuit parents who use licensed daycare centers in the Region are eligible for the subsidy.

During 2021-2022, this program reached eight communities and helped Inuit parents by supporting 207 daycare spaces for their children.



### **STORY BOOK PROJECT**

Over the past few years, QIA has worked with the Government of Nunavut, Department of Education, Early Learning and Child Care (ELCC) Division to develop and deliver a variety of resources to ELCC programs across Nunavut.

In 2020-2021, at the invitation of ELCC Division, QIA embarked on a two-year storybook development project. Under this project, QIA agreed to develop up to 16 new books for children and daycares by 2023.

### **NUNAVUT CHILDREN'S FILM FESTIVAL**

Each year, QIA supports the Nunavut Bilingual Education Society's (NBES) Children's Film Festival. This event celebrates the Inuktut language by showcasing short films and animations for children created by Nunavut filmmakers and production companies.

With easing COVID-19 restrictions, this year's Annual Nunavut Children's Film Festival was available in person in Iqaluit as well as in schools across Nunavut.

With support from QIA, NBES distributed DVDs, worksheets, and colouring sheets to 17 schools across Nunavut.

The Opportunities Fund allows QIA to support initiatives outside the set Benefits Fund programs. Each year, up to ten per cent of the money available in the Benefits Fund is set aside for the Opportunities Fund.

## IGLOOLIK MULTI-USE FACILITY \$200,000

In 2020, the Public Health Agency of Canada allocated \$1.9 million in capital funding to three Aboriginal Head Start sites in Nunavut, including the Igloolik site, for renovations or new construction. In June 2021, QIA engaged Qikiqtaaluk Business Development Corporation to develop a \$17 million funding proposal for a Multi-Use Facility in Igloolik.

The proposal included space for Aboriginal Head Start and other early learning programs; space for community cultural, wellness and Elders programming; and space for new QIA offices (over 8000 square feet in total). QIA also proposed the following activities to be approved for funding by the Opportunities Fund Committee:

- \$70,000 Cost recovery for a QIA submission to the Government of Canada's Green and Inclusive Community Building (GICB) program for the Igloolik Multi-Use Facility
- \$130,000 Seed funding for the design and build of the Igloolik Multi-Use Facility, if the GICB submission is not successful

The Benefits Fund Committee met in February 2022 and agreed to support the proposal. In March 2022, the QIA Executive Committee approved the proposal to allocate \$200,000 for the construction of a Multi-Use Facility in Igloolik. QIA anticipates the construction of the Igloolik Multi-Use Facility to be completed by the end of the 2024-2025 fiscal year.





We confirm that as of March 31, 2022 the Legacy Fund portfolio was 100 per cent compliant with the terms of the Investment Policy Statement and in line with our ongoing investment strategy.

We maintained our long-term conservative focus with a targeted goal of preserving the capital of the Legacy Fund and positioning the assets with a goal of generating a long term average annual return of 4 per cent.

Developed global equity markets including Canada continued to provide positive returns and the tactical positioning of the equity portfolio provided capital growth and income for the Legacy Fund.


Global fixed income as an asset class proved to provide a slightly more challenging environment in which to navigate with the spectra of inflation and hawkish monetary policy on the horizon. Our decision to shorten the duration of QIA Legacy Fund's fixed income investments and our strategy to have an overweight portion of the fixed income portfolio allocated to inflation-protected securities has proved to be a positive tactical strategy.

North American and Developed International equities represented 45 per cent of the Legacy Fund's investments at March 31, 2022.

Short, medium and long-term fixed income securities comprised a 52 per cent weighting in the Legacy Fund.

Our mandate continues to be capital preservation and long-term income for the Legacy Fund.

In the meantime, we maintain six per cent of the portfolio in shortterm high-interest savings, money market investments and bonds maturing within one year.
