Following [the announcement](#) by the Prime Minister at the Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity in December 2022, the Qikiqtani Inuit Association (QIA), the Government of Canada and The Pew Charitable Trusts (Pew), have signed an Agreement in Principle on closing conditions regarding the Qikiqtani Project Finance for Permanence (Q-PFP).

The Q-PFP aims to protect and conserve marine and terrestrial areas through an Indigenous-led sustainable conservation model that will support a sustainable Inuit economy and put the parties on the path to Saimaqatigiingniq (reconciliation).

The Agreement-in-Principle outlines closing conditions to be fulfilled by the parties prior to signing a Q-PFP agreement and associated agreements. It aligns with the five pillars of [QIA's Inuit Regional Approach to Sustainable Conservation](#): Regional Governance, Regional Stewardship, Infrastructure, Sustainability and Fisheries Reconciliation.

This non-legally binding Agreement-in-Principle (AIP) includes closing conditions related to the following topics:

 2. Inuit Protected and Conservation Areas (IPCAs) Closing Conditions
 3. Conservation Plan Closing Conditions
 4. Financial Plan Closing Conditions
 5. Inuit Stewardship Closing Condition

Governance Closing Conditions

1. In the Qikiqtani Region, the management of current, planned, and future federal protected and conserved areas referenced under Articles 8 and selected areas under Article 9 of the Nunavut Agreement, as agreed to by the parties, will be modified over time to conform with an Inuit-led, regional governance structure that includes a Qikiqtani Inuit Stewardship Council (QISC) and Qikiqtani Community Conservation Committees (QCCCs).
 2. The Qikiqtani Inuit Protected and Conserved Area Plan (QIPCAP) will describe a phased approach for how existing federal joint management groups will align with an Inuit-led regional governance model.
 3. The financial plan and budget for the Q-PFP will include funding for Inuit-led regional governance, as agreed to by the parties.
 4. The Government of Canada and QIA agree that Inuit-led governance and stewardship are integral to the regional conservation plan laid out in the Q-PFP.

Inuit Protected and Conserved Areas (IPCAs) Closing Conditions

An Inuit Protected and Conserved Area in the Qikiqtani Region (Q-IPCA) is a specific marine or terrestrial area that QIA has decided to protect for conservation purposes that may be recognized by Canada, and which may be supported by federal laws or regulations.

The goals of a Q-IPCA are to:

- Preserve Inuit knowledge, culture, values, and practices in protecting and increasing Inuit governing in each area.
 - Protect wildlife, habitat, biodiversity, and the natural systems that the area provides.

Conservation areas under development and in the future, including Qikiqtait (marine and terrestrial), Sarvarjaq and Tuvaijuittuq will be designated by QIA as Inuit Protected and Conserved Areas (Q-IPCAs).

Conservation Plan Closing Conditions

1. The Qikiqtani Inuit Protected and Conserved Area Plan (QIPCAP) will be written by the Qikiqtani Inuit Association (QIA) and approved by the QIA Board of Directors, with input from GoC and Donors. Once approved, QIA will share the QIPCAP with key stakeholders, including the Government of Nunavut and community organizations such as Hunter and Trapper Organizations and Hamlets. QIPCAP will not replace existing public engagement processes for current, proposed, and future designated protected areas.
 2. The QIPCAP will set out goals and steps for areas that are already protected, as well as new areas that Inuit want to protect in the future. It will also lay out how Q-IPCAAs can help Canada reach its goal of protecting 30% of its land and water by 2030.

Financial Plan Closing Conditions

1. A Financial Model, which details the Q-PFP implementation and on-going long-term costs, as well as public, private, and sustainable funding sources for the Q-PFP will be developed and agreed to between QIA, GoC and Donors.

The government will deliver at minimum \$100 million to the Q-PFP project and will consider contributing more if the project:

- a. supports and meaningfully advances QIA's leadership in conservation;
 - b. contributes to meeting Canada's protected area commitments for 2025 and/or 2030 and includes a credible plan to get there;
 - c. realizes other benefits recognized by all parties to the agreement as mutually beneficial; and
 - d. identifies contributions from philanthropic organizations.

Donor organizations will pledge at least \$1 dollar for every \$4 from the federal government for conservation and related activities, subject to their review of the Qikiqtani Inuit Protected and Conserved Area Plan (Q-IPCAP), Financial Model, and the status of the Q-PFP Closing Conditions.

The final Q-PFP Agreement will create a path to permanent funding for this project. Canada's commitments to provide money for these long-term costs will be outlined in that agreement.

Inuit Stewardship Closing Condition

1. Through the Financial Model and Financial Plan, QIA, GoC, and donors will determine funding required to establish the Nauvitqasutit program in all 13 Qikiqtani communities, taking into account existing federal protected area funding sources and Q-PFP funding from GoC and Donors.

Infrastructure Closing Conditions

1. QIA and the GoC shall make best efforts to identify potential existing funding to build eight multi-use facilities in Pangnirtung, Qikiqtarjuaq, Kimmirut, Iqaluit, Kinngait, Sanikiluaq, Sanirajak, and Igloolik, based on priorities laid out in QIPCAP. The Financial Provisions Working Group will assess costs and potential funding opportunities for infrastructure through the Q-PFP.
 2. QIA and the GoC will work together to address additional funding requirements for multi-use facilities and community harbours in Tallurutiup Imanga.
 - a. Transport Canada (TC) commits to working with the Government of Nunavut (GN) to determine if additional funds can be identified to address inflationary pressures related to design and construction of the two community harbours described in the Letter of Agreement between the GoC, the GN and QIA and the Contribution Agreement as signed between the GoC and the GN in January 2023.
 - b. The GoC (Department of Fisheries and Oceans - DFO) commits to working with QIA to address the funding shortfall to deliver a fully functional Small Craft Harbour in Arctic Bay.
 - c. The GoC (Parks Canada) commits to working with QIA to identify other potential funding sources related to the construction, operation and maintenance and recapitalization of fully functional MUFs for Arctic Bay, Clyde River, Grise Fjord, and Resolute Bay.

Fisheries Closing Conditions

1. The final Q-PFP agreement would include one or more Fisheries Reconciliation Agreements, and any additional measures if required, to collectively, promote a sustainable Inuit-owned fishery in the waters adjacent to Qikiqtani Region.
 2. The GoC will confirm that it has secured a fisheries mandate to the Q-PFP Table as soon as possible recognizing that final Fisheries Reconciliation Agreement(s) are a closing condition that must be achieved prior to June 2024, unless otherwise agreed between the parties.

"Other" Closing Conditions

1. QIA and GoC agree to collaborate to replace the Ministerial Order issued to for the Tuvaijuittuq Marine Protected Area without a gap in protection.
 2. QIA and the GOC agree that by June 2024, there will be an IIBA Agreement-in-Principle to protect Sarvarjuaq, Qikiqtait, and the Inuit-owned lands of the Belcher Islands excepting subsurface resources and rights granted to third parties.
 3. Parks Canada and QIA agree to amend the IIBA for Auyittuq, Sirmilik, and Quttinirpaaq National Parks (called the Baffin IIBA) to allow for renegotiation. Parks Canada and QIA will create a term sheet outlining the cost, scale and scope of a new IIBA, and determine how it fits within this AiP, and final Q-PFP agreement.
 4. Through the QIPCAP, QIA will suggest new areas for protection to help Canada meet its conservation goals by 2030, including conservation related to offshore fishing.
 5. The Canadian government and the donors agree to learn about and understand the findings and suggestions made by the Qikiqtani Truth Commission (QTC) to help them understand the history of the Qikiqtani Inuit and how it relates to the QPFP agreement.

6. QIA will choose specific reports and stories from the QTC that are relevant to the Q-PFP to share with everyone involved in this agreement. All parties have committed to review and discuss about how this history affects their relationship and their goals in this agreement.
