



The Qikiqtani Inuit Association (QIA) is a not-for-profit society, which represents Inuit in the 13 communities of the Qikiqtani Region of Nunavut.

QIA is a Designated Inuit Organization under the Nunavut Agreement. QIA is one of three Regional Inuit Associations affiliated with Nunavut Tunngavik Inc.; the other associations include the Kitikmeot Inuit Association and the Kivalliq Inuit Association.

Two other organizations operate under the QIA umbrella: Kakivak Association, responsible for community economic development and small businesses; and Qikiqtaaluk Corporation, created to manage economic development on behalf of QIA.

QIA established a Revenue Policy in 2016. The Revenue Policy guides how QIA should invest and distribute funds to better serve Qikiqtani Inuit. This process provides clear and transparent reporting of how money is invested and used. The Revenue Policy created two new funds:

- The Legacy Fund, which invests money for the future
- · The Benefits Fund, which delivers programs to Inuit

QIA revenues are invested in the Legacy Fund for the future. Interest from the Legacy Fund goes to the Benefits Fund.

The Legacy Fund revenues come from several sources, including payments from Inuit Impact and Benefit Agreements (IIBA) such as the Mary River IIBA, contributions to the Saimaqatigiingniq Fund, money received from Nunavut Tunngavik Inc. from mining revenues, sand and gravel projects on Inuit Owned Land within the Qikiqtani Region, interest from the Legacy Fund investments, and surplus revenues from the Economic Development Fund.

As the Legacy Fund grows, so does the Benefits Fund.

The Benefits Fund is used for social and cultural programs in the Qikiqtani Region. The Benefits Fund receives yearly payments from the Legacy Fund with an annual target return on investment of four percent.

All programs delivered under the Benefits Fund must align with and advance the Key Themes, which are established by the QIA Board of Directors, as per the Benefits Fund Policy.

QIA engaged with Qikiqtani Inuit throughout 2022, hearing clearly that they would like to see a change in how QIA saves money and have more say in how revenues are spent.

In response to this, at the Annual General Meeting in October 2022, QIA Board of Directors approved to amend and reinstate QIA By-Law 06, the Resource Revenue Policy.

Two new policies, the Revenue Allocation Policy and the Legacy Fund Policy, will replace QIA's current Resource Revenue Policy. The two new policies will allow greater flexibility both in spending money on programming for Inuit and in saving for the future.

As part of this change, two new streams of spending were created and approved: Community Resources and Opportunities, and Economic Diversification. Each community will receive a portion of these spending streams and will decide how to spend their portion.

The new Revenue Allocation Policy and the Legacy Fund Policy, as well as the two new streams of spending will come into effect on April 1, 2023.

The Qikiqtani Cultural Activities Program (QCAP) is an application-based program that provides funding for community-led projects that support Qikiqtani Inuit to learn traditional skills and get out on-the-land. QCAP fosters the preservation and transmission of traditional skills and increases participation in cultural activities. The long-term intention of QCAP is to strengthen Inuit cultural identity and empower Qikiqtani Inuit.

Individual Inuit and community groups based in the Qikiqtani Region may apply for this funding. The funding may be used for materials and supplies, rental fees for equipment and venues, fees for Elders and other instructors, administration costs, and other costs directly related to their projects.

The QIA Board of Directors has given the Benefits Fund Committee authority to approve proposals under QCAP. All QCAP applications that QIA receives are reviewed by staff for completeness and compliance with program guidelines, and then presented to the Benefits Fund Committee for consideration.

2022-2023 QCAP APPROVED PROJECTS

In 2022–2023, QIA allocated \$1,000,000 for QCAP projects across all 13 Qikiqtani communities.

QIA had two calls for applications, in August and December 2022. In total, QIA received 93 applications, of which 74 were approved for funding totaling \$1,038,149.

Projects were approved in the 12 Qikiqtani communities that submitted applications.

This year, the majority of the 68 QCAP projects delivered were related to sewing or tool making. These included sealskin preparation, kamik-making, mitten-making, tent-making, and parka-making projects. Many of the sewing programs were targeted at specific groups, such as youth and women, and incorporated camping and other skills.

Almost one quarter (16 projects) of this year's QCAP projects were land-based programs. These programs were run in all seasons and included trips by snowmobile and boat. Some were targeted at youth and others were focused on intergenerational learning. Most on-the-land programs were multi-day, overnight trips and included hunting, fishing, survival skills, and shelter-making.

Projects categorized as 'Other' included dance programs and food preparation classes.








PERCENTAGE OF TOTAL PROJECTS FUNDED PER COMMUNITY IN 2022–2023

QCAP PROJECT PROFILES

Upirngaakkut Angunasunniq, Iqaluit

Through QCAP funding, Levi Nowdluk delivered Upirngaakkut Angunasunniq. This was a five-day on-the-land program for men who have limited access to go out-on-land and who cannot readily access hunting equipment.

Nowdluk, along with guides Sean Noble and Shamus Noble, took four men on-the-land to hunt seal and harvest fish from May 13 through May 18.

The focus of the five days was to teach sea ice safety, as well as observational and hunting skills for harvesting seal and fish.

Arnakuluup Piqqusingit, Iqaluit

The Arnakuluup Piqqusingit project provided the opportunity for five Inuit youth to bond, learn, and gain confidence while on-the-land.

In July 2022, Layli Noble-Nowdluk used QCAP funding to take the youth, aged 5-10, out on-the-land. The group traveled by boat to camp and spent three nights.

Through previous years' QCAP funding, Noble-Nowdluk had purchased sewing machines to use during her camps. This year the youth were taught to make fox fur hats using those sewing machines.

Seal Pup Hunting, Arctic Bay

Samson Ejangiaq used QCAP funding to take nine participants seal pup hunting in Arctic Bay.

The participants learned hunting safety and on-the-land navigational skills. They also learned tracking skills and how to observe seal behaviour.

This program was multi-generational, with youth and adults working together to successfully harvest 14 seal pups.

QIA has been supporting Qikiqtani Inuit parents through the Daycare Subsidy since 2017. Kakivak Association delivers this subsidy on behalf of QIA, and Qikiqtani Inuit parents who use licensed daycare centers in the region are eligible for the subsidy.

During 2022–2023, Kakivak spent a total of \$565,428 towards daycare subsidies. An initial payment of \$512,753 was funded by QIA to Kakivak in the 2022–2023 fiscal year with the remaining \$52,675 to be paid in 2023–2024.

QIA supported 870 daycare spaces throughout the 2022–2023 year, with an average of 217 spaces per quarter, in the Qikiqtani Region.

In March 2023, QIA announced continuing financial support over the next five years for daycares in the Qikiqtani Region. This support will provide funding to daycares not eligible for the Government of Nunavut's \$10 per day subsidy and will also increase salaries for Inuit employees and will provide bookkeeping support.

STORY BOOK PROJECT

In 2020–2021, at the invitation of the Government of Nunavut, Department of Education, Early Learning and Child Care Division, QIA embarked on a story book development project. Story books are being authored by 10 new or emerging authors from Qikiqtani communities.

The project is in its third year, and QIA is actively working with Inhabit Media and Inhabit Education to complete, publish, and distribute additional story books.

The books from Grise Fiord, Sanirajak and Pond Inlet are in their final stages before going to press. The Arctic Bay and Clyde River books have been written and edited, with illustration in progress. The Resolute Bay and Kinngait books are in the process of being written. Inhabit Media is looking for authors from Sanikiluaq, Qikiqtarjuaq, and Kimmirut to complete their community story books.

Under the Daycare Resources program, QIA sponsored the Nunavut Children's Film Festival, which ran from February 20–25, 2023.

The Festival is an annual event that celebrates the Inuktut language by showcasing short films and animations for children created by Nunavut filmmakers and production companies.

QIA also sponsored the Nunavut Author Event, along with Inhabit Media and Inhabit Education, which took place on February 25, 2023. Both events were livestreamed on Taku TV.

The Opportunities Fund allows QIA to support initiatives outside the set Benefits Fund programs. Each year, up to ten percent of the money available in the Benefits Fund is set aside for the Opportunities Fund.

In 2022–2023, \$250,000 was available for Opportunities Fund projects, but no applications were received within the fiscal year. QIA has deferred the \$250,000 to the 2023–2024 fiscal year and will provide funding for more or larger projects in 2023–2024.





We confirm that as of March 31, 2023 the Legacy Fund portfolio was 100 percent compliant with the terms of the Investment Policy Statement and in line with our ongoing investment strategy.

We maintained our long-term conservative focus with a targeted goal of preserving the capital of the Legacy Fund and positioning the assets with a goal of generating a long-term average annual return of four percent.

The US Federal Reserve has been aggressive in trying to curb inflation with continued concerns for price instability and its long-term economic impact. With recent inflation data coming in closer to acceptable levels, along with recent concerns about liquidity for a small number of global banks, consensus suggests that the Fed may be closer to a neutral stance after significant hikes beginning in 2022.

The Bank of Canada has taken a similar stance of combatting inflation by raising interest rates before pausing during its last opportunity to move their overnight rate higher.

We are very well positioned within the fixed income portion of the portfolio having had a lower than market duration which has reduced fixed income volatility. Opportunities on the longer end of the yield curve have started to present themselves and we are using these as attractive entry points.

In addition, our value-oriented equity portfolio finished the year strongly, and Rouleau Investment Group was able to add to equity positions at lower prices than were previously possible. We have kept a 17 percent position in Canadian equities, 26 percent in the United States as well as a smaller position in dividend yielding stocks in Developed International markets such as Europe, Australia and the Far East.

Our mandate continues to be capital preservation and long-term income for the QIA Legacy Fund.
